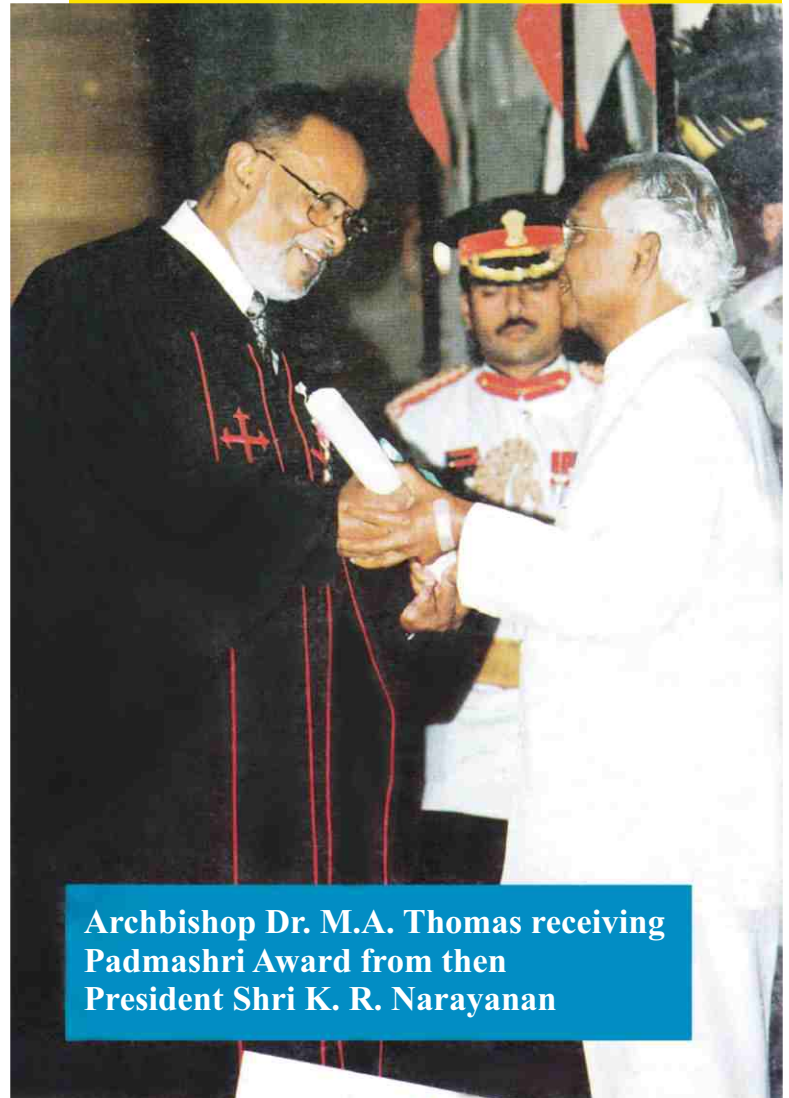

Admissions & General Policies

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be considered for admission to Emmanuel Mission School, all of the following requirements must be met :

- ❑ The admission form must be completed and duly signed by parent / legal guardian.
- ❑ Minimum age requirement must be met.
- ❑ Written examination and interview before admission.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

The following documents are required for admission :

- ❑ Birth Certificate & Aadhar Card
- ❑ Transfer Certificate, if the child was studying in another school.
- ❑ Mark Sheet of the last examination passed.
- ❑ SC/ST/OBC Certificate. In case the student does not belong to general category.
- ❑ Child's latest passport size photograph to be affixed on the Application Form.

N. B. The Minimum age for admission in Nursery is three years.

NON-DISCRIMINATORY POLICY

Emmanuel Mission Schools do not discriminate on the basis of religion, colour, caste or creed. Students of all backgrounds are welcome to our school because we believe that God created everyone in His image and all are equal in His sight.

FEES

Fee is payable at the time of admission as per the fee structure. Fee not included in the fee structure may be charged over and above the tuition fee such as building fund, sports and games fee, library fee, laboratory fee, computer fee etc. as per the management's decision.

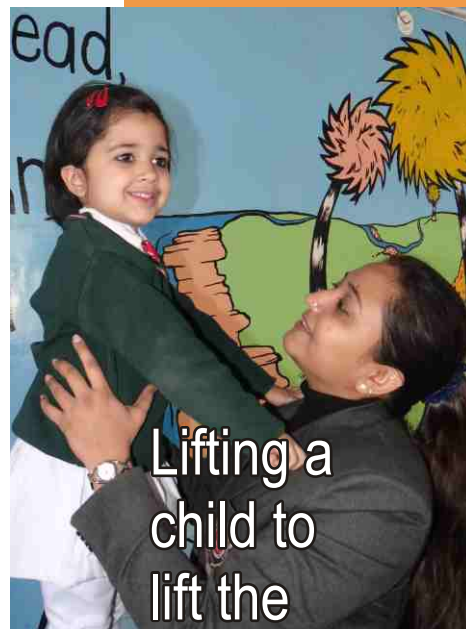
School fee is to be paid in four installements in the Bank. Failure to do so will result in a late fee and will be charged as mentioned on the fee card.

ATTENDANCE

Parents will have to see that the child is regular in attendance. Students having less than 75% attendance in class may be debarred from appearing for their final examination. In case of absence due to an emergency, an application for leave is to be submitted duly signed by the parent. Sick leave is granted only on application accompanied by a Medical Certificate. Name of a student who remains absent continuously without prior sanction for more than ten days may be removed from the rolls.

UNIFORMS

Academics

HOME WORK

It is normal for students to be given homework. Homework is an integral part of the instructional strategy at EMS, It can assist the students in their quest to acquire basic knowledge and develop their critical and analytical thinking skills. Additionally, it helps them prepare for work done in class. Parents should help students prepare for work done in class and provide practice to achieve mastery of concepts taught in class. They should also guide students to prepare early in the week for any class tests that might be given. Homework assignments are expected to be complete, accurate and neat.

TEST & EXAMINATION

There will be two Periodical Assessments, Half Yearly and Annual Examination in an academic year. The student has to clear all the examination for promotion to the next class.

A student has to secure minimum 36% marks for III division, 48% marks for II division and 60% marks for I division. He will get distinction in a subject if he secures 75% marks.

PROGRESS REPORT

Progress Report of each student is sent to his/her parents for signature after each Term and is to be returned to the class teacher. In case of unsatisfactory progress of his ward, the parent/guardian is advised to discuss the matter with the subject teacher and Principal in the interest of his/her ward.

PARENT-TEACHER MEETING

Parent-Teacher meetings are held on last working day of every month during the session. Parents are requested to attend these meetings to develop home-school communication. Such meetings are an excellent forum regarding the pupil's academic progress, behavior or attitude. Parents are not allowed to meet individual teacher during the school hours.



Rules of Conduct

A positive standard of conduct will be held for the students at all times. Because students are often subject to negative influences from other sources, it is necessary to specifically mention certain negative attitudes and behaviour that cannot be tolerated:

1. Disobeying simple ordinary classroom rules.
2. Showing disrespect and insubordination towards school personnel.
3. Bringing unnecessary and inappropriate items to the school campus. Among these are weapons, sharp objects, radios, tape recorders, cameras, distracting toys, tobacco products, alcohol, drugs, cigarette, lighters, matches, explosives, inappropriate jewellery and mobile phone etc. Such objects will be confiscated and returned only to the student's parent.
4. Unwholesome language including profanity, slang, or obscenity in words or action.
5. Strict regularity and punctuality, implicit obedience, courtesy in words and deed, cleanliness in dress and school property are expected from every pupil.
6. Irregular attendance, habitual lack of interest in school work, stealing, misconduct even outside the school premises, wilful, repeated breaches of school regulations are sufficient reasons for dismissal of the child from the school.
7. Pupils are responsible to the school authorities not only for their conduct in school but also their general behaviour outside. Any report of objectionable conduct on the part of any pupil will make him/her liable for disciplinary action. Misbehaviour on public streets and conveyances is liable to the same action.
8. The Principal, in the interest of the school and without assigning any reason, may ask a parent/guardian to withdraw his ward should the ward's conduct, behaviour or influence, in the Principal's opinion, be in any way detrimental to the common good of the school and its smooth running.
9. All pupils are required to wear the school uniform. Neatness in dress and person should be cultivated by each pupil. Long nails, nail polish, jewellery or the bringing of expensive articles to school is strictly prohibited. All should be particularly careful NOT TO THROW PAPER anywhere in the school premises. They should use waste paper baskets and bins specially provided for this purpose,
10. All are expected to speak English in school. Hindi may be spoken during the Hindi lessons only.
11. Gifts to members of staff or other demonstrations in their honour, require prior sanction of the Principal. All pupils should endeavour to excel in the practice of good manners and obedience to their teachers, Pupils are expected to attend all school functions and meetings.

Punishments: The Principal is much averse to the use of corporal punishments, but reserves the right to use this if it is necessary in the general interest of the school discipline or of the child's character.
