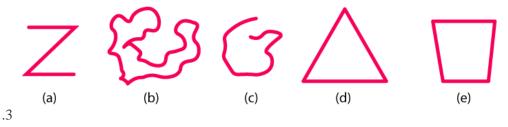

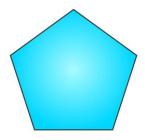

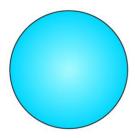

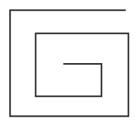

Q4. Answer the following questions:

Answer1. When and where did the Harappan Civilization flourish?

Answer The Harappan Civilization flourished from 2500 to 1500 B.C. This civilization flourished over a vast area, comprising the whole of Sindh and the Punjab, the bulk of Kathiawar, the valley of North West frontier province and a part of the Gangetic basin.

Q2. When did the earliest cities come into existence? Give the names of any five such cities.

Answer2. The very first cities were founded in Mesopotamia after the Neolithic Revolution, around 7500 BCE. Many historians think that cities and towns were first formed in Sumer around 5000 B.C. Such as Byblos, Athens, Sidon, Jerusalem and Damascus.

Q3. When and by whom were the remains of the cities of Mohen-jo-Daro and Harappa discovered? Answer3.In 1922 By Rai Bahadur Daya Ram, and by R.D. Banerjee the remains of the cities of Mohen-jo-Daro and Harappa were discovered.

Q4. Describe the plan of the city of Mohan-jo-Daro.

Answer4. Town planning:-

- 1. The streets were quite broad.
- 2. The streets and roads werte straight and cut each other at right angles.
- 3. No structure was permitted to be built beyond the desired limits.
- 4. Every house had its own dustbin.
- 5. Every street had a lightning system.

Q5. Throw some light on the town planning of the Indus Valley people.

Answer 5. Town planning:-

- 1. Cities were divided into two parts, one part was built on a raised ground called citadel.
- 2. It included public buildings, places of worship, workshop and granaries.
- 3. In case of any emergency people used to take shelter in the citadel.

- 4. Other part, which included the main city, was much larger.
- 5. It was the lower part of the city.

Q6. What is the importance of the Harappan seals?

Answer6 - An idea of the dress, ornaments, hair style, etc of the Indus Valley can be derived from the figures engraved on these seals. These seals also throw a good deal of light on the religious faiths and commercial activities of the Indus Valley people.

Q7. What were the causes of the decay of the Indus Valley Civilisation?

Answer7 - Causes of the decay of Indus Valley civilization are:-

- 1. The fertile land was encroached upon by the neighbouring desert, making it unfit for cultivation.
- 2. Floods in the Indus river might have destroyed the area.
- 3. The Aryan invasion resulted into the destruction of native people.
- 4. Earthquakes and other epidemics could have been the cause for the abrupt end of the civilization

Q5. Give reasons why

1. We say that the Indus Valley Civilisation flourished beyond the Indus valley.

Answer It flourished in the basins of the Indus river, which flows through the length of Pakistan, and along a system of perennial, mostly monsoon- fed, rivers that once coursed in the vicinity of the seasonal Ghaggar-Hakra river in northwest India and eastern Pakistan.

2. The people of Mohen-jo –Daro were well – versed with town planning.

Answer Mohen-jo-Daro has a planned layout with rectilinear buildings arranged on a grid plan .Most were built of fired and mortared brick, some incorporated sun-dried mud-brick and wooden superstructures. Sites were often raised, or built on man- made hills. This could be to combat flooding in the near by areas.

3. We say that trade existed between Indus Valley and Sumer.

Answer. Numerous seals of Indian origin with Indus script and Brahmani bulls have been found at various Sumerian sites. Likewise, various imports from Sumer, recovered in the Indus Valley, clearly indicate trading between India and Sumer in ancient times.
