- Q1. What do you mean by democracy?
- **Ans.** The word 'democracy 'come from two Greek words, which together mean 'people's rule'. A democracy is a government that involves all the citizens in sharing power.
- Q2. How was the idea of rule of law developed?
- Ans. The Glorious Revolution (1688) laid the foundation of the first democratic principle of the **Rule of law.** Earlier it was believed that the king's wishes were the law. The people protested against this principle and by dethroning their king (King James II of England) in 1688 and by passing the Bill of Rights they established the idea that the country should be ruled by laws passed by the people or the Parliament and not by the whims of an individual.
- Q3. What is the importance of right to vote?
- Ans. The importance of right to vote is is that ,It gives you political equality because after a long struggle the right to vote which is called franchise or suffrage, was slowly and steadily extended to all .But still there was a flaw .The franchise or right to vote was not extended to women.The struggle for this continued and ultimately the women also got the right to vote like men. When the right to vote is given to every adult in a country ,it is called Universal adult franchise.
